CADDIS OUTTING February 10th 2012

The Caddis outing is February 10th, 2012 at Newlands Resort in Lakeview Arkansas. The weather at this point is looking "really good". The club is providing breakfast two mornings and supper Saturday night (cooked by Charlie Sessions). Please let Jerry know as soon as you can if you can get there Friday by 3:00PM for the tour of WASPI that afternoon.

If you have ever been fly fishing on any of the rivers in Arkansas you know that the Sow Bug or Aquatic Isopod (above) is an integral part of our trout's food chain. These little guys are poor swimmers and are full of protein, making them an easy choice for the local trout.



Luckily for us fly fishermen, the sow bug is one of the easiest flies to tie as well. Here is what you will need:

- Recipe:
Hook: TMC 3769 size 12-18
Thread: UNI- thread 6/0 Tan
Back: Scud Back/Ziploc Bag
Body: Sow-Scud Dubbing/ cream
Rib: UNI- thread/ same
Lead wire: 0.15

The addition of a bead head is at the discretion of the tier.





Tying this fly can be done in 5 easy steps

Step 1: Make 6-8 wraps of your lead wire, centering it on the shank of the hook, then attach your thread and wrap to the back of the hook.

Step 2: Tie in ribbing, then scud back. While at the rear of the hook, loosely spin the dubbing onto the thread.

Step 3: Dub forward, making a small cigar shaped body. Then proceed to pull the Scud Back forward, tying in behind the eye of the hook.

Step 4: Rib the body into 6-8 segments, tie off the ribbing, and whip finish.

Step 5: Take a bodkin, Velcro, or an old toothbrush and pick out some legs from the underside of the fly.
